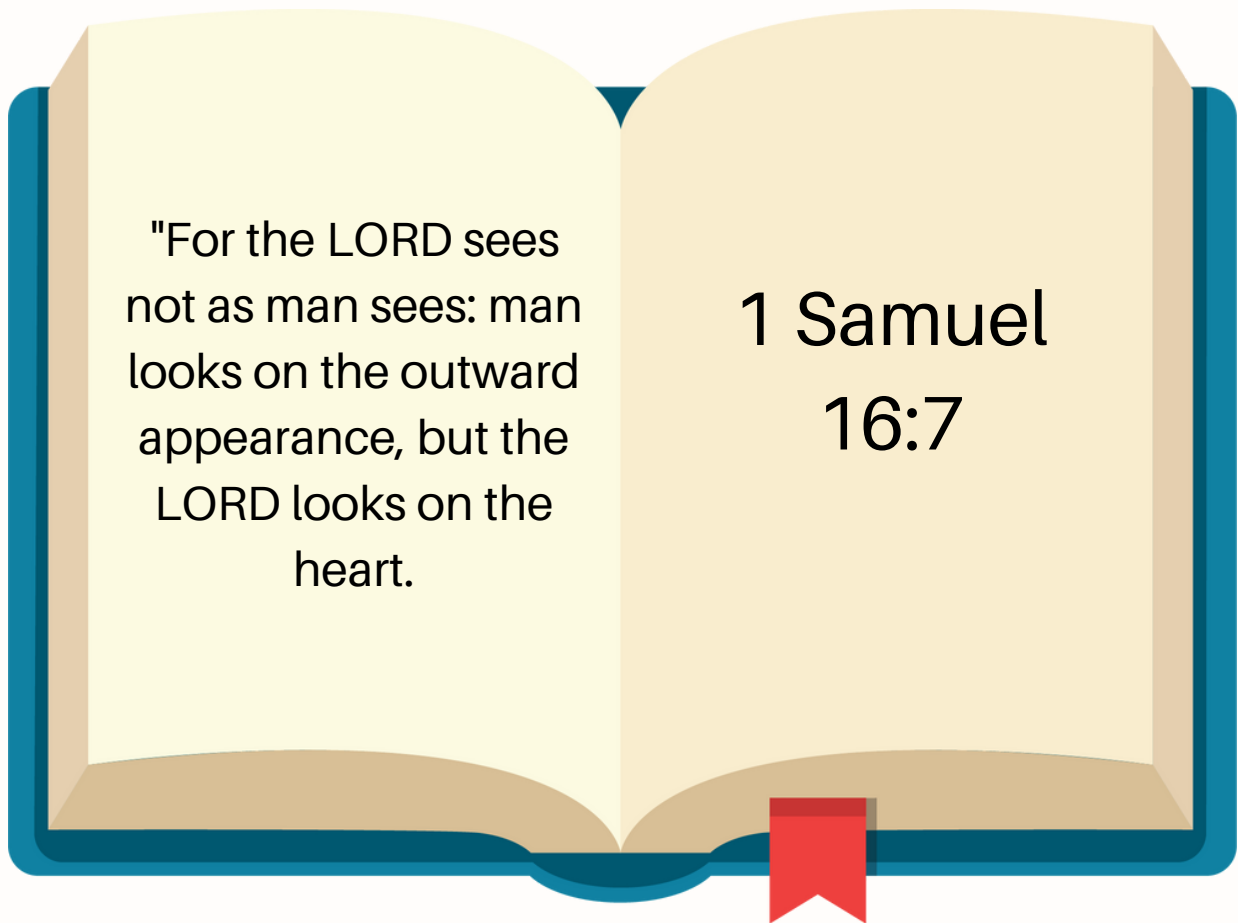

Bad or poor character

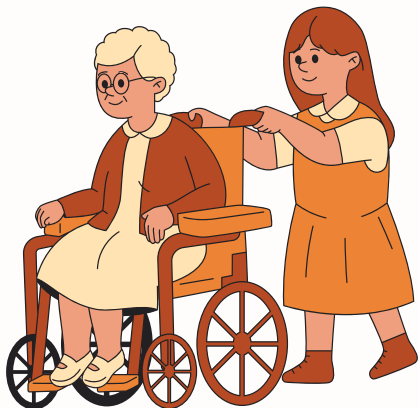

Many people look at others and judge them by their skin color. They decide a person's character and importance because of it.



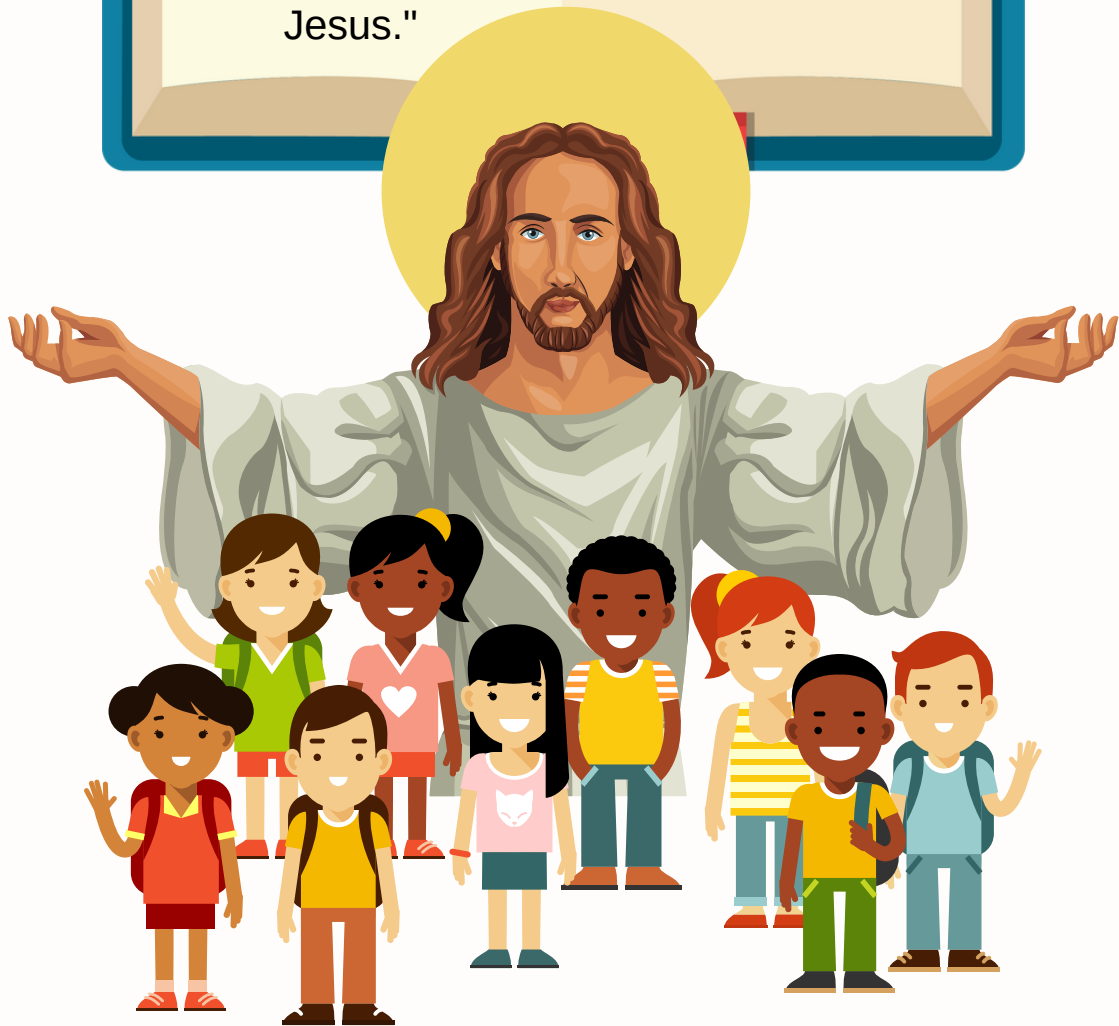

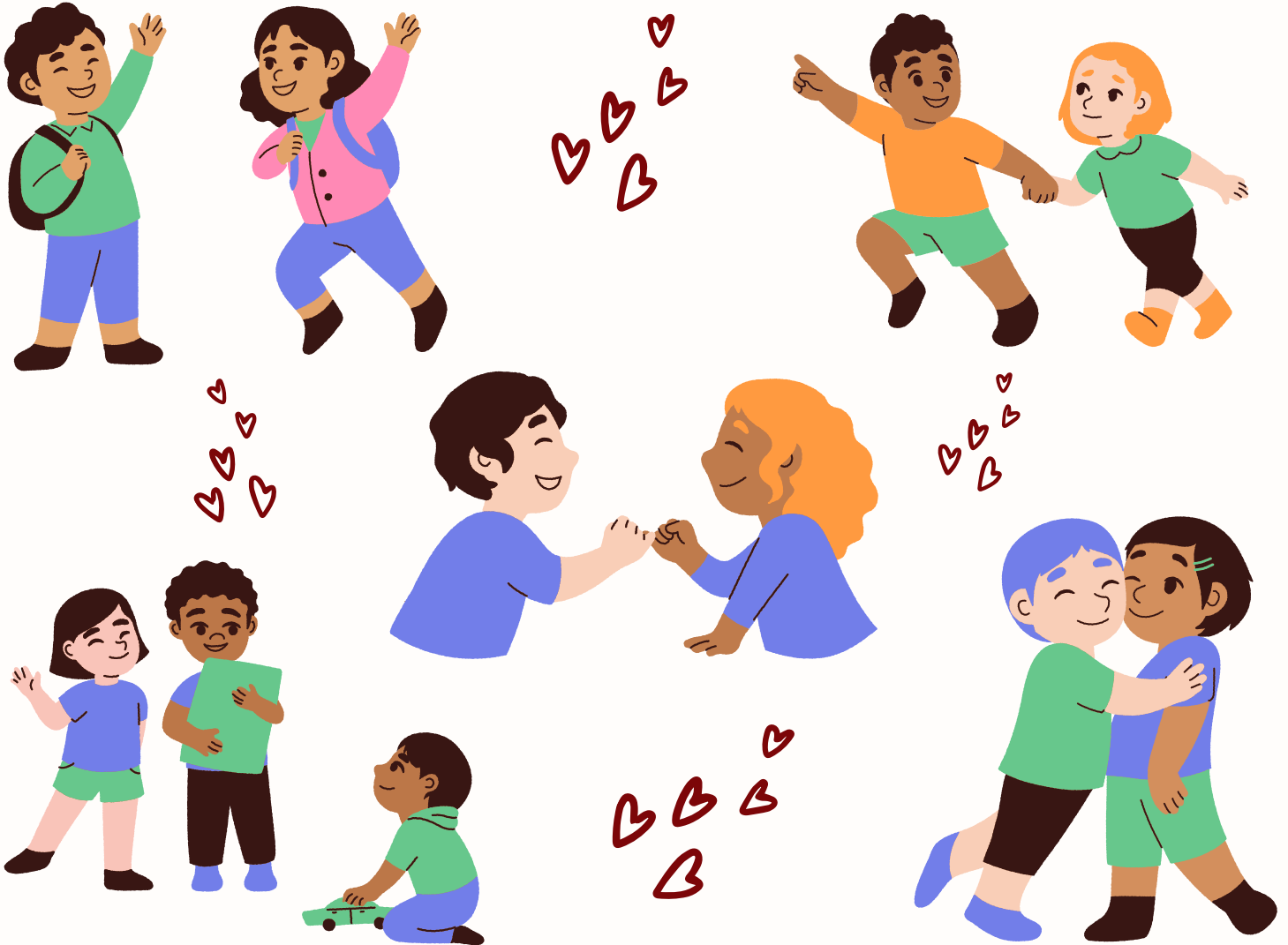

A WORD TO PARENTS

The purpose of this book is to instill in your child a biblical worldview of different ethnicities, often referred to as race, and to equip you in fighting the battle against the anti-biblical ideology that practices racism in the name of anti racism, known as Critical Race Theory or CRT.

. CRT is a destructive, demeaning, and regressive worldview that is rooted in cultural Marxism and has crept into the cultural mainstream, including the school systems.

Because of society's increasing acceptance of this destructive worldview, there is more division between people of differing ethnicities than ever before.

Children are being taught, through CRT, to view everything through the lens of skin color, including passing judgment as to a persons beliefs, motives, and worth, rather than making judgment by a persons character. This makes CRT inherently racist in and of itself because it promotes segregation; something that we largely overcame years ago. This is not how God wants us to judge the worth and value of others.

We are not unique as individuals solely in our ethnicity. Yes, we have cultural and ethnical differences which can be recognized and respected but they should never be used as a way of promoting one race while degrading another.

Please take the time to talk to your school aged children on a regular basis about that they are learning in school as well as the books they may have access to when it comes to CRT.

I encourage you to be diligent in teaching your children a healthy, biblically sound view of ethnicity by reading books such as this with your children and educating yourself as well as to what is being taught in the area of CRT and why this is not in line with our Christian worldview.

Openly discuss with your child God's view of us all as equally created in His image and worthy of respect, compassion, and dignity as individuals because of this.
